

CLUB REGISTRATION POLICY / PROCEDURE. MUSTANGS ON THE MOVE

NOTE: it is the Member's responsibility to ensure their vehicle complies with the Code* and relevant legislation. A MR334 completed by MOTM does not sanction compliance.

- (a) Each MOTM membership number is eligible for one (1) vehicle / Log Book to be issued 'at no cost', i.e. included in membership fees.
 Extra vehicles / Log Books can be include in the scheme for a fee. Currently this is \$10 per additional vehicle / Log Book issued. The fee is payable on initial issue of the additional Log Book.
- (b) Member/s applying for Club Registration must provide to the Authorised Officer all relevant documentation identifying the vehicle/s is eligible for club registration.
- (c) Mustangs On the Move requires the vehicle/s be sighted by the Authorised Officer, who must be satisfied the vehicle abides by the conditions detailed in the Code and meets the objectives of Mustangs On The Move before issuing a MR334 / Log Book.
- (d) Where a MOTM Member resides more than 100km from the Adelaide CBD the Authorised Person may accept suitable documentation identifying the vehicle/s eligibility for club registration and issue the MR334 / Log Book if they believe the vehicle complies.
- (e) If in the opinion of the Authorised Officer there are concerns to the extent of modifications to the vehicle or the safety of the vehicle the Member must provide evidence to show the vehicle abides by conditions detailed in the Code.
 - (i) Evidence may include a K-Net Number / certificate, with appropriate notes, or a recent identification / roadworthy inspection.

Where a Member cannot provide documented evidence for any identified modification of concern/s the vehicle/s is to be referred to the Committee* for a determination, prior to a MR334 / Log Book being issued.

- (f) The Authorised Officer must refer to the Committee any vehicle, (in their opinion) that may be considered inappropriate for the MOTM Club Registration Scheme. Upon referral the Committee will make a determination on the vehicle/s eligibility to enter the MOTM Club Registration Scheme Examples of referral include but are not limited to the following:
 - (i) The vehicle/s does not appear to meet the requirements of the club registration Code and/or relevant legislation requirements,
 - (ii) The vehicle is not in the spirit of MOTM objectives,
 - (ii) The vehicle is obviously dangerous,
 - (iii) The vehicle is unkempt and/or in poor condition with no obvious attempts at repairs.
- (g) A Member may appeal a decision of refusal to accept a vehicle into the scheme by writing to the MOTM Committee via normal mail, or email, and provide suitable evidence and/or documentation supporting their application to the MOTM Club Registration Scheme.
- (h) The MOTM Committee and Authorised Officers will have the right to request a visual inspection of a member's vehicle on MOTM Club Registration at any time. Refusal of a request for inspection may result in the cancellation of the vehicle's MOTM Club Registration.
- * Code: Club Registration Code of Practice A 90 Day conditional registration scheme for Historic, Left Hand Drive and Street Rod Vehicles - effective 1 July 2017
- * Committee: Where a vehicle is referred to the MOTM Committee, the Committee will consult with its Authorised Person/s and seek further opinion on the eligibility of the vehicle to the scheme. The Member will be advised of the decision and reasons for that decision.
